Monday was a very exciting day for the Robins class. Mr Harnden came into school to work with the children on their Great Fire of London topic. The children spent most of the morning outdoors, learning about the fire triangle, finding out how to light a small fire and cooking twists of bread over the flames. In order for the children to get a real feel for how the fire spread back in 1666, they created their own small houses. These houses were then placed closely together and set alight using the embers from the camp fire. The children were able to see how the fire spread quickly from house to house.
