Building Work Update

As I'm sure you are aware, the building work is really coming together now and, all being well, we are heading into the final stages of the project. We are expecting the new Year 1/2 classroom to be ready during the first week back after half term and the hall is scheduled to be handed over in early April. While the school is closed for half term, work will continue on the refurbishment of the junior and adult toilets. At the same time, the reconfiguration of the school kitchen will begin and I am expecting it to be out of action for around three weeks when school re-opens. This means that immediately after the half term break, the school kitchen will not be able to provide hot food. Mrs Dutton and I have met with Edsential to agree the following catering arrangements for this period of time.


Interim School Lunch Arrangements



Each day, a selection of sandwiches will be on offer at Mrs D's Deli Bar. Choices will be provided to the children each morning and will include regular options for sandwiches such as ham and cheese. Others, including chicken tikka, tuna and egg mayonnaise will be rotated through the week. Pitta breads and wraps will

accompany regular sandwich options. Salad, juice and fruit will be provided each day alongside a rotation of homemade biscuits, cakes and yogurts.

The reconfiguration of the kitchen includes the creation of a new servery in the new hall and extensive internal works. This means that it is just not possible for the kitchen to run as normal during this time. I'm sorry if these temporary arrangements cause any inconvenience. The school will do its utmost to have a full lunch service back in operation as soon as possible. Thanks in advance for your patience during this part of the building project and do let me know if you have any questions about these short-term arrangements.


Top Class: 22nd February at 5.00 pm on CBBC
