Covid-19 Update

We have been notified of further positive cases in the Kestrels and Robins classes this week and I would like to thank parents for following Public Health advice and booking PCR tests. All children and staff who are identified as contacts should book a test. The majority of cases reported in school have come through precautionary PCR tests where children are asymptomatic or have very mild symptoms similar to a common cold-runny nose, sore throat and headache.

The infection rate is continuing to increase across Cheshire West and Chester. The health and safety of pupils and staff is paramount and we appreciate your support and understanding as we work hard to manage this situation.


