At Tilston this year, we have made a bespoke programme for the teaching of phonics and spelling, carefully looking at specific needs of every child in our school. We will dedicate 15 minutes every day when the children will work in small groups across the school, differentiated to meet their individual needs. Groups will be reviewed regularly and children will move accordingly. Our hope is that great progress will be made.

## **Healthy Snacks**

Our EYFS and KS1 pupils will continue to receive a piece of fruit at break time. Toast/bagel and a cuplet of juice are available to pupils in KS2 from Mrs Evans and the cost is **60p**.
