Use of PP Funding	Impact
Small group teaching assistant support	Small group TA support helped develop pupils' confidence across a range of year groups and curriculum areas.
	Teachers lead 'keep up' daily interventions to address misconceptions allowing children to progress through the sequence of lessons in class.
1:1 teaching for Y6 pupils (with an additional teacher)	This was scheduled for February 2021 but due to Covid-19 we were closed until March 8 th and SATS assessments were cancelled May 2021.
Subsidising residential visits for pupils in Key Stage 2	Small groups of children received financial support for the residential visits in the summer term 2021. Year 5&6 visited Alderford Lake and Year 3 & 4 experienced an overnight camp on the school site. The residential visit planned was cancelled due to Covid-19 restrictions.
Enrichment activities	Due to Covid-19, we have been unable to attend any events outside school.
Resources including the ELSA programme	Training has continued for staff to implement the ELSA (Emotional Literacy Support) programme to a small groups of pupils. The ELSA programme enables pupils to reflect on themselves and the choices they make, develop a more positive self-image and improve their confidence in order to express their feelings; as a result, pupils are now demonstrating a more positive outlook in school alongside emotional awareness and social skills.



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	The ELSA programme has been a critical tool in supporting children during the pandemic.
Lego Therapy	Lego Therapy is a social development programme for young people with autism spectrum disorders. Resources were purchased and training provided to support groups of pupils with social interaction and communication difficulties. As a result, the resource is being used to support children building friendships and to develop social skills.
Outdoor Exploring	All children from nursery to year 6 take part in a weekly outdoor exploring session. The sessions have been used to provide play based situations where children can reconnect with friends following the pandemic.
