This year we have launched our new and exciting Outdoor Exploring lessons. A very special thank you to Mr Harnden, who has kindly donated our amazing bell tent! The children have enjoyed being part of the set up this week and look forward to using the tent over the next few months- this will also provide some much needed shelter at times too!

As we approach winter, we would like to clarify clothing arrangements. Every Wednesday, House Martins and Kestrels will have an Outdoor Exploring session for one hour per week.
