This week there has been a significant rise in infections across the county, some outbreaks in primary and secondary schools, with some schools facing part or full closures. Two thirds of cases reported have been between adults. It is vital we continue to work together to implement our safety measures to keep staff, children and families safe.

- Please wear a face covering at all times when dropping off and collecting.
- Please arrive at your allocated time. If you arrive early, please wait in your car until your time; this will help to avoid contact with people outside family bubbles.
- Please follow the one-way system- IN through the small gate and OUT via the big gate; this stops face to face contact.
- Please keep a 2 metre distance AT ALL TIMES.
- Please come onto the yard to collect your child and leave the school premises immediately- this is to ensure we minimise contact between adults.
- Please do not stand behind the wall as this blocks the footpath.
- Dogs are not allowed on the school premises.

What to do if your child displays symptoms.

If your child has any of the following symptoms:

Key symptoms

High temperature Persistent cough Loss of taste or smell

Possible symptoms

Runny nose Diarrhoea

You must self-isolate immediately.

Do not come to school.

Book a test-119/NHS website or visit the walk-in testing centre:

Little Roodee Car Park, Grosvenor Road, Chester. You do not need to book an appointment but be prepared for a short wait.

If your child displays symptoms, we will contact Public Health for advice and will work closely with you to ensure you know the current guidance. The guidance is changing daily but we have daily updates from the Department of Education and Public Health England and will keep you updated.

A Negative Result

Your child can return to school once they are feeling better.



A Positive Result

Your child must stay home for 14 days.

Please inform the school immediately.

Public Health England will work with us to identify all contacts.

Public Health England will write to parents, if your child is a contact, to inform you of any action being taken.

If a bubble has to close, children in the bubble will need to stay home for 14 days.

Siblings in different bubbles will not need to self-isolate as they are classed as a contact of a contact.

Our Remote Learning, via The Pupil Area on our website, will be used (as it was throughout lockdown) Login details have not changed. Please contact Mrs Farmer if you need a copy of your child's login details.

If a child in the self-isolating bubbles displays symptoms, they must get a test immediately.

Children and staff can return following a 14 day self-isolation period.

We are doing everything possible to minimise the risk of infection in school. The virus is still prevalent and we all need to continue to be vigilant at all times.

Please help us to stay safe and keep Tilston School open.
