Welcome Back!

It has been great to see you all again this week. We have lots going on in the half term ahead so please read through this week's news and make a note of the many events and activities that we have planned in the build up to Easter. A summary of key dates can be found below.

Term Dates

I am sure that you have realised that the Easter weekend falls earlier in the year in 2016 and as we are following the CWaC term dates, this means that Good Friday and Easter Monday fall before the two week 'Spring Break' in April. School Hall Design

The design team from Cassidy and Ashton has just produced drawings of the proposed floor plans and elevations for our brand new hall. These are now displayed in the hall and you are very welcome to come into school to have a look. The proposals have been shared with the children, staff and governors and we are all very excited! Do come inside, take a look and let me know what you think.

Fundraising

A number of fundraising ideas are now taking shape and we really need **YOUR** support. While the school has been given a fixed budget from the Local Authority, unfortunately this does not include kitting out the hall with the fixtures, furnishings and equipment we would like to have in it. There is every chance that we will be required to scale back the building plans should the budget not stretch far enough.

Our fundraising target of £50 000 is based on a wish list produced by the staff and children and includes staging, dining tables and chairs, indoor sports equipment and apparatus, seating for visitors, a projector/interactive TV, a large whole school art piece and glass doors. Perhaps individual fundraising events and initiatives could be linked to a specific item on the list.



World Book Day: 3rd March

To celebrate World Book Day on Thursday next week, we will be having a 'Bedtime Story' theme. We are encouraging the children to come into school in pyjamas, dressing gowns and onesies with a
