At Tilston Parochial CE Primary School, we endeavour to provide a high-quality physical education curriculum that encourages our pupils to live an active and healthy lifestyle both now and in their future adult lives. Our aim is to ensure as many pupils as possible have the opportunity to engage in sport each week and have the courage to take part in competitive sport whether that be in intra, inter school sports or sports within the community.

Physical education is not only PE lessons, but the many hours of playtimes, extra-curricular clubs, the golden mile, adventurous activities and outdoor exploring, they all contribute greatly to the health, fitness and well-being of our children. Sports Premium Funding

This funding is ring fenced and can only be spent on improving provision of PE and sport in school. The DFE guidance states that possible uses for funding may be:

- Hiring specialist teachers/coaches to work with Primary teachers when teaching PE.
- Paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport.
- Running sports competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in School Games.
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport.
- Providing places for pupils in after school sports clubs and holiday clubs.
- Hiring specialist teachers/coaches to deliver modules on healthy lifestyles.
